Webex – Video Best Practice



Turn your video on

Sharing video can be intimidating at first, but having your camera on will keep you aware of the conversation and connected with your audience.

Camera position - get your angles right

Think about where your webcam is positioned and keep it at eye height for the most natural look. This gives a warm, open look. You might also want to place the camera slightly left or right from your face so that you appear from your favorite angle.

Find your light

Good lightning can make all the difference: too much light behind you can make it look like you're in witness protection, while too much light in front can wash you out or create strange shadows. Get it just right by adjusting your curtains or blinds and having a warm light on your desk.

What's behind you

Think about what's behind you and in the view of the camera. When home, double check for personal items you did not intend to share in your background. Clear the clutter and create a backdrop that the people you are meeting with will enjoy seeing. Your background is a great conversation starter and a window to your personality.

Choose audio over video

When your connection quality is low, your collaboration experience gets worse. Webex will suggest or automatically lower your resolutions and may eventually turn off your video. You can also do this at any time.
