State and Local Aid Breakdown

\$16.3 Billion for Florida

Total amount of funding provided to Florida for state and local relief aid, to keep essential workers safely on the job and fight to rebuild the economy following the COVID-19 pandemic. Local governments of every size, including all counties, cities, towns, and villages, receive dedicated federal aid awards. A new critical infrastructure projects program was included to support state broadband deployment efforts.

Funds are allocated in Florida as follows:

- **\$9 billion** for Florida State Government
- **\$1.46 billion** for Florida Metro Cities
- **\$4.1 billion** for Florida Counties
- **\$1.39 billion** for Florida small cities, towns, and villages
- **\$364 million** for Florida State Broadband Investment Program

State and local recipients could use the funds to:

- Respond to the Covid-19 emergency and address its economic effects, including through aid to households, small businesses, nonprofits, and industries such as tourism and hospitality
- Provide premium pay to essential employees or grants to their employers. Premium pay couldn't exceed \$13 per hour or \$25,000 per worker
- Provide government services affected by a revenue reduction during the pandemic
- Make investments in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure

To receive these allocated funds, state and local governments will need to submit a certification signed by an authorized officer. Funding will come in two tranches – both tranches would provide 50% of the total allocation. Once certified, Treasury will have 60 days to provide payment for the first tranche and the second payment will come 12 months after the first payment. Funds must be spent by December 31, 2024. State and local governments will have to report how funds are being used and how tax revenue was modified through “periodic reports.” The U.S. Treasury will define what “periodic” means.

How ARP State and Local Funds are Allocated

In President Joe Biden's \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan, \$360 billion is provided to help state, local, tribal, and territorial governments mitigate fiscal effects tied to the Covid-19 emergency.

States and the District of Columbia: \$195.3 billion – Florida's share: \$9 billion

- \$25.5 billion equally divided between states and the District of Columbia
 - Florida will receive at least \$500 million
- \$169 billion based on the state share of total unemployed workers
 - Florida is estimated to receive \$8.5 billion

Local Governments: \$130.2 billion – Florida's share: \$6.95 billion

- \$65.1 billion to cities using a modified Community Development Block Grant Formula
 - \$45.57 billion for municipalities with populations of at least 50,000
 - Florida has 62 metropolitan cities. Florida is estimated to receive \$1.46 billion or 3.2%. See page 5 for a breakdown of funds to Florida cities.
 - \$19.53 billion for municipalities with populations of less than 50,000, with allocation capped at 75% of the locality's most recent budget as of January 27, 2020
 - Florida has 346 towns. Florida is estimated to receive \$1.39 billion or 7.1%. See page 6 for a breakdown of funds to Florida towns.
 - Funding to these towns will go through the State (same process for how non-entitlement CDBG funds are awarded). The State has 30 days from receiving payment to distribute these funds to the towns. States that miss this deadline will have to return undistributed funds back to the Treasury.
- \$65.1 billion to counties based on population
 - Florida's 67 counties are estimated to receive \$4.1 billion or 6.3%. See page 9 for a breakdown of funds to Florida counties.
 - Due to the prohibition on duplication of benefits, county funding would be slightly altered to the extent that such cities apply for and receive funding as a metro city under this proposal.

Tribal Governments/Territories: \$24.5 billion – Florida's share: N/A

Critical Infrastructure Projects: \$10 billion – Florida's share: \$364 million

- Each state, District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico will receive a minimum allocation of \$100 million, plus another \$100 million is divided among other U.S. territories, and another \$100 million is designated for Tribal governments and Native Hawaiian use.
- Of the remaining funds, states would receive an additional allocation based on a formula. The formula is as follows: population (weighted at 50 percent), number of individuals living in rural areas of the state as a percentage of the U.S. rural population (weighted at 25 percent), and proportion of the state's population of households living below the poverty line (weighted at 25 percent).
